WHEREAS, the said virginia Light of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, has on the 11th day of May, 1910, purchased from Wallace Campbell, certain property, consisting of the following described real estate, to-wit:

(The northwest quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section Two (2) Township Nineteen (19) North, Range Twelve (12) East of the Indian Meridian, all being in Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, and containing forty (40) acres, more or less according to the United States Government survey thereof, less two and twenty one hundredths (2.21) acres, being a part of the right of way, of the M. K. & T Railway Company

WHEREAS, the above described land, was a part of the allotment of James Nail, a Creek Indian, Roll No. 2401, of three-quarter blood, enrolled August 23rd, 1899, and

WHEREAS, on February 23, 1910, the Department of the Interior, of the United States Government, issued an order, removing the restrictions from James Nail, the allottee aforesaid, on the land above described, which said order for removal of restrictions, bears date of February 23, 1910, and signed by Frank Pierce, First Ass't. Secretary of Interior and recorded March 26, 1910, at 8:15 A.M. in Book 78, page 642, of the records of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and said restrictions were removed from the above described land, and the said James Nail, allottee, without conditions, concerning terms of sale and disposal of proceeds, and

WHEREAS, there appears upon the records, in Book Q, under date of May 2, 1905, at Sapulpa, Oklahoma, formerly, ^{Sapulpa} Ind. Ter., one certain assignment, bearing date of April 1, 1905, from Arkansas Valley Oil & Gas Company, to Osage and Oklahoma Company, which said assignment purports to cover the above described land, and said assignment refers to one certain lease from Adesta F. Berry, as Guardian of James Nail, to Guffey and Galey, bearing date of June 25, 1903, purporting to effect the above described land, also, a transfer of said property, or lease hold interest therein, from the said Guffey & Galey, to the Arkansas Valley Oil & Gas Company, and

WHEREAS, there appears upon the records, at Sapulpa, Oklahoma, formerly Sapulpa, Ind. Ter., in Book Q, bearing date of April 1, 1905, recorded May 2, 1905, one certain mortgage, given by the Osage and Oklahoma Company, to Union Trust Company, of Pittsburg, purporting to effect the above described lands, and

WHEREAS, there appears upon the records at Sapulpa, Oklahoma, in Book V, page 388 bearing date of June 12, 1905, recorded January 20, 1906, one certain contract from James Nail, allottee above described, to the Peoples Gas Company, purporting to effect the above described land, and

WHEREAS, there appears upon the records of Sapulpa, Oklahoma, in Book 17, page 465, bearing date of December 20, 1904, recorded April 27, 1906, one certain oil and gas mining lease, from James Nail—the above named allottee, to the Riverside Oil and Gas Company (a corporation) purporting to be an oil and gas mining lease, upon the lands above described together with other lands, and

WHEREAS, there appears upon the records at Tulsa, Oklahoma, in Book 52, page 221, bearing date of February 6, 1909, recorded April 2, 1909, one certain right of way contract from James Nail, to Texas Company, a Corporation, of Texas, purporting to deed a right of
