

north Range 14, ^{East} was allotted to Thomas Pumpkin, a full blood Creek Indian, as his allotment of the lands of the Creek Nation. The court finds that the said Thomas Pumpkin died in the year 1899 leaving to his widow, Deconthla Pumpkin, an undivided one half interest in and to his allotment hereinbefore described, and that at the death of the said Deconthla Pumpkin, which occurred subsequently to the death of the said Thomas Pumpkin, the petitioner, Lucy Cooper or Wolfe, became the owner in fee simple of an undivided one third interest in and to the undivided one half interest so inherited by her mother, Deconthla Pumpkin.

The court further finds that there was allotted to Andwe Fox, a fullblood Creek Indian, as her allotment of the lands of the Creek Nation, the Southeast quarter of section 14, Township 16 North Range 13 East, and that at the death of the said Andwe Fox, which occurred in the year of 1900 she left an undivided one fourth interest in her said allotment to the said Deconthla Pumpkin; who was a cousin to the said Andwe Fox, and at the death of the said Deconthla Pumpkin, the petitioner, Lucy Cooper or Wolf, became the owner in fee simple in and to an undivided, one third interest in the undivided one-fourth interest inherited by her mother, Deconthla Pumpkin, in the allotment of the said Andwe Fox.

The court further finds that the said Lucy Cooper or Wolfe has sold her undivided interests in and to the lands above described, to G.W. Barnes, for the sum of \$645.00; that said sum is a fair and reasonable consideration for said land; and that it is to the best interest of the said petitioner that her interest be sold, It is therefore considered, ordered, adjudged and decreed that the conveyance by Lucy Cooper formerly Lucy Wolf, of her interest in the above described land to G.W. Barnes of Muskogee, Oklahoma, is hereby in all things approved and confirmed.
