

of more than 4,800 acres, and further finds that the property herein leased is a part of said aggregate area, then the secretary of the Interior may cancel this lease in the same manner as provided for in the case of any violation of the terms of said lease.

It is further agreed and understood that the approval of this lease shall be of no force or effect, unless the party of the second part furnish within sixty days from the date of approval of the application filed in connection herewith, a bond to the satisfaction of the Secretary of the Interior, in accordance with the regulations of March 20, 1905, prescribed by the Secretary of the Interior, which shall be deposited and remain on file in the Indian office during the life of this lease.
