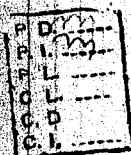

Chattel Mortgage With Power of Sale.



KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That A. B. Sawyer of Tulsa, Indian Territory of the first part, in consideration of the sum of One hundred and 77/100 DOLLARS to him in hand paid by L. B. Drew of Tulsa, Indian Territory of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has he bargained and sold and by these presents do he bargain and sell unto the said party of the second part, his executors, administrators and assigns, all the following articles of personal property, the same being the absolute property of, and now in possession of said party of the first part at his farm or ranch in the said miles south District of Tulsa in the Western Nation, and within the Western District, Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of the four-ninths interest of the said A. B. Sawyer in all of the corn grown on the cultivated part of the Rachel Drew allotment, known as the Pierson place in Section 36 Township 19 North Range 12 East of the Indian Meridian in the said Western District, Indian Territory, during the year 1907

Provided, always, and these presents are upon this express condition? That if the said party of the first part shall pay, or cause to be paid, to the said party of the second part, or to his executors, administrators or assigns, the fees for releasing this mortgage, and the aforesaid sum of \$ 100.00

according to the terms of one certain promissory note of which the following is a synopsis, viz:

Rate of interest 8 per cent from maturity, then these presents and everything herein contained shall be void. But if default shall be made in the payment of said sum of money or any part thereof, or the interest thereon, at the time or times when by the condition of the said note the same shall become payable, or if said party of the second part shall at any time deem himself insecure for any cause, without assigning any reasons therefor, or if said property is removed from the district aforesaid, then and thenceforth it shall be lawful for said party of the second part, his executors, administrators or assigns, or his authorized agent to declare said note and mortgage due, and to take said goods and chattels wherever same may be found, and dispose of same or so much as may be necessary, without appraisal (the appraisal required by law being hereby expressly waived), at public auction, at the place where said property is found or taken, or at Tulsa, Indian Territory for cash in hand, upon two weeks notice in some newspaper published in the

District, or the county where taken, or by written notices posted in five (5) conspicuous places near the property, at which sale any of the parties hereto may purchase as other parties, and out of the proceeds of said sale, the said party of the second part to retain the sum due him, as herein set forth, and the cost of this trust and of sale, rendering the overplus, if any, to the said party of the first part, his executors, administrators or assigns, and if from any cause said property shall fail to satisfy said debt and interest aforesaid, said party of the first part hereby agrees to pay the deficiency and until default be made as aforesaid, or until such time as the party of the second part shall deem himself insecure as aforesaid, the said party of the first part to continue in the peaceable possession of all the said goods and chattels, all of which, in consideration hereof, he engages shall be kept in as good condition as the same now are, and taken care of at its proper cost and expense. It is hereby represented, and this mortgage is accepted on the faith of said representation, that there are no liens or claims of any kind on the above property, but this mortgage is a first lien thereon.
