This Indenture, Made this 4th day of February A. D. 1910,
 between James D. Hard and Eva G. Hard his wife of
Gillinsville, Rogers
Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and Jessie M. Langworth, of
Springfield, Illinois of the second part.

WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of
Twenty-four hundred & ~~no~~ ⁷⁵ Dollars,
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part,
 his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and
 State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The north one half (1/2) of Southeast one-quarter (S.E. 1/4)
 of section thirty-four (34) Township Twenty-two (22) North,
 Range Thirteen (13) East of the Indian Base and Meridian
 containing eighty acres more or less.

This deed is given subject to a certain mortgage
 for \$1000 executed by said James D. Hard and Eva G. Hard
 his wife, to Lucilla F. Stewart of Wellington, Kansas
 which mortgage is to be assumed by party of second part
 and is a part of the purchase price herewith.

 for their heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that

 clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what
 nature and kind soever; excepting as above set forth.

 said party of the first part their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
