WITNESSETH, The said party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of \$14.00.00
One hundred Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part,
his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and
State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

Lots numbered one (1) two (2) three (3) four (4) five (5) in block number
Twenty four (24) in the Midland Addition to the town of Bixby, Okla.,
according to the survey and plot of said Addition as shown on the
public record as Tulsa Okla.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in
any wise appertaining forever.

And said Henry Hornecker and Belle Hornecker, his wife
for their heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that
at the delivery of these presents that they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance,
in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free,
clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what
nature and kind soever;

and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, against
said party of the first part, their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
