WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Forty-three Thousand One Hundred 00 00 Dollars,
 the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part,
 heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and
 State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The Suthwery 90 feet of lot 3 in Block 99 in the City of Tulsa
 Oklahoma, according to the government plan and survey thereof.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in
 any wise appertaining forever.

And said first parties,
 for their heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that
 at the delivery of these presents, they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance,
 in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free,
 clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what
 nature and kind soever; save and except all severage taxes due or to become due subsequent
 to the year 1907, all of which grantees sever and agrees to pay as part of the purchase
 price, and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, against
 said party of the first part, their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
