This Indenture, Made this 13th day of May, A. D. 1913, between Laura M. Harrison and William Harrison, wife and husband

Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and Charles A. Drake of the second part.

WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Two thousand and no/100 Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part, heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

All the West Twenty four (24) feet of Lot one (1) and the East thirteen (13) feet of Lot two (2), in Block one (1) of the Bliss addition to the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.

And said Laura M. Harrison and William Harrison for their heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that at the delivery of these presents that they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unincumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and kind soever, except mortgage for \$500.00 to the Inter State Mortgage Trust Company and general or special taxes not now due and payable which said party of the second part and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part heirs and assigns, against said parties of the first part their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
