This Indenture, Made this 16<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1910 A. D. 1910,

between James H. Baker and Bertha F. Baker his wife of  
 Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and  
Sime Berry of the second part.

WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of  
Eighteen Thousand (\$1800.00) and 00/00 Dollars,  
 the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part,  
her heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and  
 State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

All of Lot three (3) in Block two hundred (200) except the  
 Northwesterly Sixteen (16) feet of said lot in the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma,  
 according to the government survey thereof and being more particularly described  
 as a plot of ground having a frontage of 83.7 feet on Detroit Avenue and a  
 depth of 140 feet and a width of 24.1 feet bordering the alley in said Block 200.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in  
 any wise appertaining forever.

And said James H. Baker and Bertha F. Baker his wife for themselves and  
 for their heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that  
 at the delivery of these presents they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance,  
 in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free,  
 clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what  
 nature and kind soever;

and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part to his heirs and assigns, against  
 said party of the first part their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
