WITNESSETH, The said part of of the first part, in consideration of the sum of
Two Thousand Two Hundred (\$2,000.00) and Dollars,
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell, and convey unto the said part of of the second part,
his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and
State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The East one-half (E. 1/2) of Northeast one-quarter
 (N.E. 1/4) of Section Sixteen (16) Township Twenty-one (21)
 North Range Thirteen (13) East of the Indian Base
 and Meridian, containing eighty acres more or less.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in
 any wise appertaining forever.

And said James D. Hard and Eva G. Hard, his wife
 for their heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said part of the second part, that
 at the delivery of these presents they were lawfully seized in their right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance,

 said part of the first part — their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
