This Indenture, Made this 31st day of January A. D. 1910,  
 between James M. Cobb, and Gertrude R. Cobb his wife, of Pittville, Johnson  
 County, Missouri, of the first part, and L. J. Atwood, of Boone, Iowa,  
 of the second part.

WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of  
 Four Thousand one hundred twenty-one & 6/100 and (\$4121.65) Dollars,  
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part,  
 heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit: The north half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of Southeast Quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) and Southwest  
 Quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Northeast Quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ), and Southwest Quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Southeast Quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Northeast Quarter ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Six (6), Township Twenty-one (21) North, Range Fourteen (14) East of the Indian Base and Meridian, less three and eighteen - one hundredths (3.18) acres occupied by the K. O. C. & S. R.R. Right-of-Way, containing One hundred Twenty-six and 82/100 acres more or less.

This deed is given subject to a first mortgage of \$1450<sup>00</sup> in which a payment of \$150<sup>00</sup> has been made, executed by James M. Cobb and Eva G. Ward, his wife to Luella F. Stewart, Wellington, Kansas, dated January 2-1909, Filed January 5, 1909 at 3 P.M. and recorded in Book 51, Page 3 in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for Tulsa County, at Tulsa, Oklahoma, due November 1st, 1913 with interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, this mortgage to be assumed by party of second part. Also certain oil and gas mining leases executed to the Beauchene Oil and Gas Company, Tulsa, Oklahoma, the same to be assumed by party of second part.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.

And said James M. Cobb, and Gertrude R. Cobb, his wife, for their heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that at the delivery of these presents they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and kind soever, excepting as above set forth.

and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part, their heirs and assigns, against said parties of the first part, their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
