This Indenture, Made this 5th day of March A.D. 1910.
between James D. Ward and Eva G. Ward, his wife, of Collinsville, Rogers
Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and L. J. Atwood, of Collinsville, Oklahoma
of the second part.

WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of
One Thousand Five Hundred & no/100 181500⁰⁰ and Dollars,
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part,
his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and
State of Oklahoma, to-wit, Southwest Quarter (S E 1/4) of Southeast Quarter (S E 1/4) of Section Six (6) Town
ship Twenty-one (21) North Range Fourteen (14) East of the Indian Base and
Meridian, Containing forty acres more or less.

This deed is given subject to a certain deed of trust for \$600⁰⁰ executed by Nellie J. Chambers in her own right, and Maxwell Chambers, her husband, to Harry Lee Taft, dated February 24th, 1909, Recorded March 1st, 1909 in Book 28 at Page 17 of the Records of Register of Deeds for Tulsa County, Oklahoma, due December 1st, 1918 the same to be assumed by party of second part and is a part of the purchase price herewith.
Also to a certain deed of trust for \$117.15, executed by Nellie J. Chambers, in her own right, and Maxwell Chambers, her husband, to Harry Lee Taft, dated February 24th 1909, Recorded March 1st 1909 in Book 28, Page 145 of the Records of Register of Deeds for Tulsa County, Oklahoma, the same to be assumed by party of second part, and is a part of the purchase price herewith. Also to a certain oil and gas mining lease, the same to be assumed by party of second part, and he shall receive all royalties and rentals accruing therefrom.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.

And said James D. Ward and Eva G. Ward, his wife
for their heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that
at the delivery of these presents, they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and kind soever, excepting as above set forth.

and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part his heirs and assigns, against
said party of the first part, their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
