## DEED—GENERAL WARRANTY.

This Indenture, Made this 25th day of June,  
between James D. Ward, a single man of Bellmead, Rogers  
County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and Jacob A. Zepke, of Tulsa, Kansas  
of the second part.

WITNESSETH, The said party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of  
four thousand and five hundred dollars (\$4500.00) and Dollars,  
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, doth by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part,  
his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and  
State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The north half (1/2) of southwest quarter (SW 1/4) and southwest quarter (SW 1/4) of  
southwest quarter (SW 1/4) of section one (1) of township twenty one (21) north, range thirteen (13)  
east of the Indian Baseline and Meridian containing one hundred twenty acres (120.00) more  
or less. This deed is given subject to a certain mortgage for \$1000.00  
to Harry Lee Taft, trustee, dated September 24th, 1908, due December 1st, 1918, interest at  
six percent, and to a certain second mortgage for \$203.70 dated September 24th,  
1908, in favor of Harry Lee Taft, one half (1/2) of each of the mortgages to be assumed  
by party of second part, and are made a part of the purchase price herewith.

Also to a certain mortgage for \$1000.00 in favor Grant R. M. Cullough  
dated March 1st, 1910, due March 1st, 1915, with interest at six percent, same to  
be assumed by party of second part and is made a part of the purchase price  
herewith. Also certain oil and gas mining leases, the same to be assumed by party  
of second part, said party of second part to receive all rentals and royalties. First  
party hereby assigns all his right, title and interest in and to said oil and  
gas <sup>mining</sup> leases to party of second part <sup>To have and to hold the same, together with all land situate in the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in</sup>  
any wise appertaining forever.

And said James D. Ward, a single man  
~~for himself his~~ heirs executors or administrators, doth hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that  
at the delivery of these presents, he is lawfully seized in his own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance,  
in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free,  
clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what  
nature and kind soever; excepting as aforesaid forth.

and that he will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part his heirs and assigns, against  
said party of the first part his heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
