Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and Peter C. Hiebert, of Millboro, Kansas
of the second part.

WITNESSETH, The said party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of

Twenty-one hundred & twond 00 (\$2,102.00) and Dollars,
the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do ll by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part,
his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and
State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

Lots three(3) and four(4) in section one(1) Township twenty-one(21)
north, range thirteen(13) east of the Indian Base and Meridian, containing
80.96 acres, more or less.

This deed is given subject to a certain mortgage for \$600.00
executed by Thomas H. Collins and Lota V. Collins, his wife, to B. H. Kishner
dated August 1st, 1908, due August 1st, 1913. Bearing six percent interest
the same to be assumed by party of the second part, and is a part of
the purchase price herewith. Also to a certain oil and gas mining lease
dated May 1st, 1907 executed by Thomas H. Collins to Julius Lyons of Kansas
City, Mo. same lease to be assumed by party of the second part.

First party hereby transfers and assigns all his right, title and
interest in and to said lease to party of the second part and
second party is to receive all rentals and royalties from this date.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in
any wise appertaining forever.

And said James O. Ward, a single man
for himself his heirs, executors or administrators, do ll hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, that
at the delivery of these presents he is lawfully seized in his own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheri-
tance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free,
clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what
nature and kind soever; excepting as above set forth.

and that he will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part his heirs and assigns, against
said party of the first part their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
