## QUIT-CLAIM DEED.

THIS INDENTURE, Made this 29 day of April in the year A. D. 1911, between George H. Barnes, Jr., of the first part, and heirs of Moses Naharkay, deceased, of the second part:

WITNESSETH, That the said party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of One and 20/100 dollars, to him duly paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby quit-claim, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns, forever, all right, title, interest and estate, both at law and in equity, of, in and to the following-described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The north half of the Southwest quarter of the Northeast quarter of the Northwest quarter (1/4 of 1/4 of 1/4 of 1/4) of Section Twelve (12) in Townships Nine and Ten of Range Twelve (12) East of the Meridian.

Laid above described land being now known as Harbour Addition to the City of Tulsa.

together with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging. To have and to hold the above-granted premises unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, forever.
