COSS MORTGAGE COMPANY, its successors or assigns, the following-described premises, situate in the County of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit:The North half of the North west Quarter (N 1/2 NW 1/4) and the North half of the South half of the North west Quarter (N 1/2 S 1/2 NW 1/4) less Railroad Right of Way of Missouri, Kansas and Texas Railway.

By Ross Sandersonof Section numbered thirteen (13), Township numbered eighteen (18), North Range numbered fourteen (14), East of the Indian Meridian, containing in all One hundred and fourteen acres of land, more or less, according to Government Survey thereof.TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME, Together with all and singular the improvements thereon and the appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining, and all rights of homestead exemption, unto the said party of the second part, and to its successors or assigns, forever. And the said party of the first part covenant and agree that at the delivery hereof he is the lawful owner of the premises hereby conveyed, and seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein, free and clear of all incumbrances, whatsoever, and he will warrant and forever defend the title to and possession of the same unto said party of the second part, its successors or assigns, against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever. This conveyance, however, is intended as a mortgage for thebetter securing of the said sum of Twenty eight hundred and 00/100 DOLLARS, justly due and owing by the said party of the first part to the said Virgil R. Coss Mortgage Company, its successors or assigns, and evidenced by one certain promissory note, bearing even date herewith and due on the first day of September, A. D. 1916, and bearing six per cent. interest from date, payable semi-annually, evidenced until maturity by interest coupon notes thereto annexed, and ten per cent. interest after maturity, given for an actual loan of money.

It is expressly understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto, that this mortgage is the first lien on the premises hereby conveyed; that the party of the first part will pay the indebtedness hereby secured at the time and place and in the manner provided in said note, and will also pay all taxes and assessments levied against the premises hereby conveyed when due, and will neither commit nor permit any waste upon said premises, or the removal of any building or other improvements therefrom without the written consent of said second party first had and obtained.

Upon payment of said promissory note according to the tenor and effect thereof, being well and truly made, then, in such case, this conveyance shall become null and void, and shall be released at the cost of the first party; but in case of failure or default in the payment of said promissory note when due, or any other part thereof, or any interest thereon, at maturity; or in case of default in the payment of any taxes or assessments levied against either the premises hereby conveyed or the indebtedness hereby secured; or if the insurance on the buildings, as hereinafter provided, be not kept in force as stipulated; or if the party of the first part do, or suffer to be done, anything whereby this security is impaired, then upon the happening of any such contingencies, the party of the second part, its successors or assigns, may pay such taxes and assessments, and any other sum or sums necessary to preserve and protect such security, and may provide the necessary insurance on the buildings, and all such sums so expended shall bear interest at the rate of ten per cent. per annum, and this mortgage shall stand as security therefor.

The party of the first part agree to procure and maintain policies of insurance on the buildings located on the premises hereby conveyed, in such insurance companies as said second party shall elect, in the sum of Two thousand and 00/100 DOLLARS, with premiums therefor fully paid, which said policy or policies shall be assigned to and held by said second party, its successors or assigns, as collateral and additional security for the payment of the indebtedness hereby secured.

It is further stipulated and agreed, that in case the party of the second part, its successors or assigns, shall hereafter appear in any of the land departments of the General Government, or any court or tribunal whatever, in order to preserve or protect the title to or possession of the premises hereby conveyed and warranted, that all such costs and expenses incurred therein shall bear interest at ten per cent. thereafter; and that in case of a foreclosure hereof, and as often as any proceedings shall be had or taken to foreclose same, the holder hereof may recover from the first party an attorney's fee of fifty dollars, which sum shall be due upon the filing of a petition in foreclosure; and for all such costs, expenses and attorney's fees, this mortgage shall stand as security.

It is further agreed and understood, that upon a breach of the warranty herein, or upon the failure or refusal to pay the principal indebtedness hereby secured when due, or any part thereof, or any interest thereon, at maturity, or any tax or assessment herein mentioned, or to comply with any requirements herein contained, that the whole sum hereby secured shall at once, and without notice, become due and payable, at the option of the holder hereof, and shall bear interest thereafter at the rate of ten per cent. per annum, and the said party of the second part, its successors or assigns, shall be entitled to a foreclosure of this mortgage, and to have the said premises sold and the proceeds thereof applied to the payment of the indebtedness hereby secured; and that immediately upon the filing of the petition in foreclosure the holder hereof shall be entitled to possession of said premises, and to each and every part thereof, and to collect and apply the rents therefrom, less the reasonable expenditures, to the payment of said indebtedness; and for this purpose the holder hereof shall be entitled to a receiver, to the appointment of which the mortgagors hereby consent, which appointment may be made either before or after the decree of foreclosure; and the holder hereof shall in no case be held to account for any damages, nor for any rental other than those actually received. The appraisalment of said premises is hereby expressly waived.
