ORDER.

And now on this 6th day of December, 1909, came on to be heard; the petition of Luke Fox the owner of the lifeestate of Maggie Fox deceased;

Said petitioner appearing by his attorneys Mars & Mars and after hearing the testimony and the argument of counsel; and the court being fully advised in the premises, doth find;

That Maggie Fox was a full-blood Creek Indian, and duly enrolled as such; that by reason thereof, she had allotted to her the following described real estate, to wit:

The South-west quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section fourteen (14) Township Sixteen (16) North Range Thirteen (13) East containing one hundred sixty (160) acres more or less.

The court further finds that the said Maggie Fox died intestate on the 30th day of October, 1903, leaving as her sole and only heirs at law Luke, ~~for~~ husband, and Mary, Ada and Katie Fox daughters and Henry Fox, son all of said childrens and minors, Luke Fox their legal guardian.

The court further finds that the said Maggie Fox estate is pending in this court and that this Court has jurisdiction thereof and that she had no issue born to her since the fourth day of March, nineteen hundred and six;

The Court further finds that the said Luke Fox, was the husband of Maggie Fox, is the owner of the life estate in said lands, , said Maggie Fox deceased, on the 12th day of Aug. 1909, made and executed to J. F. Pantler his certain warranty deed, conveying to said J. F. Pantler all of his right and title in and to the said interest in the above described land; which said deed was delivered to this court pending the approval thereof.

The Court further finds that the consideration of One Thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars, for the above described land aforesaid, is adequate, and that one Thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars has been paid by said J. F. Pantler into this court for the said legal representative of the said Maggie Fox, allottee, deceased.

IT IS THEREFORE here now, by the Court considered, ordered adjudged and decreed that the deed as presented herewith be and the same is hereby approved according to Section 9, of an Act of Congress approved May 27th, 1908, entitled
