GUARDIAN'S DEED.

THIS INDENTURE, Made the 18th day of May nineteen hundred and ten at Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, by and between E.E. Cooper the duly appointed, qualified and acting guardian of Ethel Bough, a Minor party of the first part, and C.E. Suppes the party of the second part.

WITNESSETH, That whereas, on the 9th day of April 1910 the county Court within and for the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, made an order of sale, authorizing the said party of the first part to sell certain real estate of the said Ethel Bough, a minor, situated in the County of Tulsa State of Oklahoma, described in said Order of Sale,

And whereas, under and by virtue of said Order of Sale and Pursuant to legal notices given thereof, the said party of the first part, on the 2nd day of May A.D. nineteen hundred and ten sold the hereinafter described real estate specified and described in said order of Sale, subject to confirmation by said Court for the sum of Fourteen Hundred and No/100 dollars, to C.E. Suppes, he being the highest and best bidder and that being the highest and best sum bid.

And whereas the said County Court, upon the due and legal return of said sale proceedings under the said Order of Sale, made by the said Party of the first part on the 2nd day of May A.D. 1910, set the hearing of said return of sale for May 13th, 1910, and after due and proper notice of said Hearing had been given, did on May 13th, 1910, continue said hearing to May 18th, 1910, and on which date hearing was had at the Court thereupon did on the 18th day of May 1910, make an order confirming said sale, and directing conveyances to be executed to the said party of the second part, a certified copy of which order of confirmation was recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of said Tulsa County, within which the said land sold is situated on the 18th day of May A.D.
