KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That the Arkansas Valley Townsite Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the United States in force in the Indian Territory in consideration of One \$----dollars, cash in hand paid by to it by Coweta Gin Coal and Mill Co. the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, does hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto Coweta Gin Coal and Mill Co. all the following described parcel of land situated in the town of Broken Arrow, Creek Nation, Indian Territory, said parcel of land being known and designated upon the townsite plat of said town as:
