That the said Emzrthla was afull blood Creek Indian as shown on the Citizenship rolls of said nation, opposite roll number 6874; that as such citizen he had alloted to him by the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes of Indians, as his separate allotment of land, the following described real estate s situated in Tulsa County, to-wit: The southwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section 7, and the Northeast quarter of the Southeast quarter of section 22, and the west half of the souhwest quarter of section 23, all in Township 19 North, range 12 Bast, containing one hundred and sixty acres of land.

That the said Emarthla died intestate in Tulsa County on the 2nd day of June surviving, 1910, leaving him as his sole heirs at law:

Gabriel Emarthla, his won.

Kizzie Jefferson, his daughter,

Mary Emarthia, his wife,

That upon the death of the said Emarthia, the heirs above named each became vested with an inheritable fee simple title in and to an undivided one third interest in the above described real estate.
