Journal Entry and Decree.

This cause coming on to be heard before His Honor L.M. Poe, Judge of the 21st Judicial District on this 7th day of October, 1908, it being one of the judicial days of a regular term of this Court, and after hearing the evidence, Court finds that plaintiff and defendant were legally married on the 15th day of September, 1903, that they lived together as man and wife untill about May 1st, 1908, when the defendant contracted the disease called gonorrhea by reason of illicit intercourse with some woman other than the plaintiff. The court further finds that the plaintiff at once ceased to live and cohabit with defendant. The court further finds that the maiden of plaintiff was Anna E. Smith.

Now, therefore, it is ordered, adjudged and decreed that the plaintiff be divorced from the bonds of Matrimony between the plaintiff and defendant and that she be restored to her maiden name as fully as if she had never married the defendant. It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that this decree will have full force and effect on and after six months from this date.
