plaintiffs, Fred and Georgia Ann Froe, by A.L. Snyder, their legal guardian by the consideration of the said court, recovered, a judgment against the said defendants for partition of the real estate described in the petition of the plaintiffs and the answer and cross petition of defendant I.B. And whereas, on the said 6th day of June A.D. 1910 at two o'clock P.M. of that day, at the Court House door aforesaid, the said sheriff did offer for sale and sell the lands and tenements hereinafter described to I.B. Lumpkin at and f for the price and sum as follows, viz: Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars cash in hand said sum being the highest and bests bid made therefor, and being more than two thirds of the appraised value of the said lands and tenement.
