OIL AND GAS MINING LEASE UPON LAND SELECTED FOR ALLOTMENT, CHEROKEE NATION, INDIAN TERRITORY.

This indenture of lease, made and entered into, in quadruplicate on this 15th day of August, A.D. 1904, by and between John W. Twist, of Lowery, Indian Territory, party of the first part, and The Continental Oil and Refining Company a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the state of Kansas, and authorized to do business in the Indian Territory, of Independence Kansas party of the second part, under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 72 of the act of Congress approved July 1, 1902, and the regulations prescribed by the secretary of the Interior, thereunder.

WITNESSETH, that the party of the first part, for and in consideration of the royalties, covenants, stipulations and conditions hereinafter contained, and hereby agreed to be paid, observed and performed by the party of the second part, its successors and assigns for the term of fifteen (15) years from the
