I, W.S. Bailey, upon my cath do say: That I am a resident and citizen of Tulsa Count, Oklahoma; that I was present in the Court room of the County Court of said County and State on the ---- day of way, 1910, when the North Fifty (50) feet of Lot Six (6) in Block One Hundred and Seventeen (117) of the City of Tulsa was sold by Amelia K. Crowell, administratrix of the Estate of Robert A. Growell, deceased to Dan J. Davisson, under and by virtue of an order of said court; that Edward Crowell was present in the Court Room at the time of said sale and that said Ralsa F. Morley, an attorney, of Tulsa, Oklahoma, was also present representing said Edward Crowell; that when the sale of said land above described was called up for confirmation by said court, said Ralsa F. Morley, attorney for Edward Crowell, announced publicly that the firm of Ramsey and Worley, of which he was a member, had filed a suit in the District Court of Tulsa County, entitled Edward Gre Crowell vs Amelia K.
