I, C.L. Holland, upon my oath do say: That I am a resident and citizen of Tulsa County, Oklahoma; that I was present in the Court Room of the County Court of said County and state on the\_\_ day of May, 1910, when the North fifty (50) feet of lot six (6) in Block One hundred and Seventeen (117) of the City of Tulsa was sold by Amelia K. Crowell, Administratrix of the Estate of Robert A. Crowell, to Dan J. Davissen under and by virtue of an order of said Court; that Edward Crowell was present in the Court Room at the time of said sale and that said Ralsa F. Morley, an attorney, of Tulsa, Oklahoma, was also present representing said Edward Crowell; that when the sale of said land above described was called up for confirmation by said Court, said Ralsa F. Morley, attorney for Edward Crowell, announced publicly that the firm of Ramsey and Morley, of which he was a member, had filed a suit in the District Court of Tulsa County, entitled Edward Crowell V. Amelia K. Crowell, and others, wherein said Edward Crowell was claiming that he owned the house located on said North 50 feet of said lot 6 in Block 117, and asking for a judgment for \$500.00 for the value of same; that he, as attorney, for said Crowell, has filed in said County Court a protest against the confirmation of said lands; that thereupon R.C. Allen an attorney of Coweta, Oklahoma, who was representing Amelia K. Crowell, the administratrix, stated publicly that if the said Edward Crowell would withdraw his protest to the confirmation of said sale and release all right, title and claim that he, the said Crowell, had against said property, that said Amelia K. Crowell, the administratrix would deposit \$500.00, the amount of money claimed by said Crowell
