

## Deed Record, No. 87, Tulsa County.

COMPARSED

This Indenture, made this 17th day of September A. D. 1910  
between Fred G. Shaw and Minna May Shaw, his wife

of Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and W. E. Rose (a single man)

of the second part.

WITNESSETH, That the part of the first part, in consideration of the sum of One thousand five hundred and no/100 Dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said part of the second part, his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and State of Oklahoma, to-wit: The northerly thirty (30) feet of lot No. five (5) and the southerly ten (10) feet of lot No. six (6) all in Block No. Twenty Seven (27) of the original town of Tulsa, Oklahoma, said forty (40) feet frontage to be uniform the length of one hundred and forty (140) feet to an alley, according to the official plan and survey thereof, more particularly described as parts of lots five (5) and six (6) in Block No. Twenty Seven (27), described as the part of lot five (5) which adjoins lot six (6) and has a frontage of thirty (30) feet on Boston Avenue and extends one hundred and forty (140) feet to an alley with a uniform width of thirty (30) feet and all that part of lot six (6) which adjoins lot five (5) and has a frontage of ten (10) feet on Boston Avenue and extends one hundred and forty (140) feet to an alley with a uniform width of ten (10) feet in the city of Tulsa Oklahoma, according to the official plan and survey thereof.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining forever.

And said Fred G. Shaw and Minna May Shaw his wife for their heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said part of the second part, that at the delivery of these presents they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free, clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and kind soever; Except all special tax assessments for street paving and that we will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part's heirs and assigns, against said parties of the first part — their heirs, and and all every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
