This Indenture, Made this 23 day of May

between Mary P. Wilhite and Artie Wilhite of Jackson Co. Mo. and Art. Wilhite and F. L. Wilhite all single and Flora H. Nelson and her husband W. L. Nelson of Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and Victor Cucini of Tulsa, Oklahoma

of the second part.

WITNESSETH, The said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of \$31.00 and no/100 Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said part of the second part, his heirs and assigns, all of the following described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

All of their undivided five sixths interest in parts of Lots (4) Four and (5) Five in Block 76 according to the official Plat of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma. These Fractional Parts of the lots are as follows Beginning 55 feet from the South West Corner of Block - and then running Northerly (160) one hundred and sixty feet thence East (28) Twenty Eight feet thence Southwardly (160) One hundred and sixty feet thence West (28) Feet to the place of beginning with the exception of the Railroad Right of way which now runs across these fractional parts of Lots.

and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said part of the second part, his heirs and assigns, against said parties of the first part, their heirs, and all every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
