## DEED—GENERAL WARRANTY

THIS INDENTURE, Made this 31st day of Dec., A.D. 1912, between  
Hazel C. Bristow, a single woman of Oklahoma,  
Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, of the first part, and E. Hersey,

of the second part:

WITNESSETH, The said part of the first part, in consideration of the sum of \$25.00,

Twenty five hundred and DOLLARS,  
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part,

his heirs and assigns, all of the following-described real estate, situated in the County of Tulsa,  
and State of Oklahoma, to-wit: The easterly one hundred feet of the  
southerly fifty (50) feet of lot three (3) in Block Forty  
one (41) of the city of Tulsa, Oklahoma, according to the  
official plat thereof, the same being 50 feet frontage  
on the Boston Ave. by 110 feet on East Archer St. in  
the said city.

To have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in  
anywise appertaining, forever.

And said Hazel C. Bristow,  
for her heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part,  
that at the delivery of these presents, she lawfully seized in her own right of an absolute and indefeasible  
estate of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above-granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the  
same are free, clear, discharged and unencumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances,  
of what nature and kind soever; except taxes and assessments for the year  
1911 and thereafter,  
and that she will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said party of the second part, her heirs and  
assigns, against said party of the first part, her heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
