 WITNESSETH, The said part ies of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred  
Fifty and no/100 and  DOLLARS,  
 the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents Grant, Bargain, Sell and Convey unto the said part 4 of the second part,  
his heirs and assigns, all of the following described Real Estate, situated in the County of Tulsa and State  
 of Oklahoma, to-wit:

All of that certain undivided interest in and to the North Half  
(1/2) of the North East Quarter (1/4) of Section Number Eight (8) in  
Township Number sixteen (16) North of Range Number Fourteen (14)  
East and the Southwest Quarter (1/4) of the North West Quarter (1/4)  
of Section Number Thirty four (34) in Township Number seventeen (17)  
North of Range number Thirteen (13) East of the Indian Base and  
Meridian which the said Jersey Johnson nee Bruner inherited as  
one of the heirs at law of Lizzie Agent deceased the Original  
Allotte said interest being not less than an undivided one third  
(1/3) interest in said premises

 for themselves their heirs, executors or administrators, do hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said part 4 of the  
 second part, that at the delivery of these presents they are lawfully seized in their own right of an absolute and indefeasible estate  
 of inheritance, in fee simple, of, in and to all and singular the above granted and described premises, with the appurtenances; that the same are free,  
 clear, discharged and unincumbered of and from all former grants, titles, charges, judgments, taxes, assessments and incumbrances, of what nature and  
 kind soever;

and that they will warrant and forever defend the title to the same unto said part 4 of the second part his heirs and assigns,  
 against said part ies of the first part their heirs and all and every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
