

If the lessee makes reasonable and bona fide effort to find and mine coal and asphalt in paying quantity, as is herein required of him, and such effort is unsuccessful, he may at any time thereafter, with the approval of the Secretary of the Interior, surrender and wholly terminate this lease upon the full payment and performance of all his then existing obligations hereunder: Provided, however, that approval of such surrender by the Secretary will be required only during the time his approval of the alienation of the land is required by law.

It is further agreed and understood that before this lease shall be in force and effect the lessee shall furnish a satisfactory bond in accordance with the regulations prescribed by the Secretary of the Interior, which bond shall be deposited and remain on file in the Indian office.

It is expressly understood and agreed by the parties hereto that if the Secretary of the Interior is at any time satisfied that any of the covenants contained herein, or that any of the provisions of any regulations heretofore or that may hereafter be lawfully prescribed by him, have been or are being violated, he may, after ten days' notice to the party cancel this lease and that his declaration of cancellation shall be effective without resorting to the courts, and without further proceedings, and that the lesser shall be entitled to the immediate possession of the land.
