ORDER APPROVING DEED.

It appearing to the Court from the verified petition of John Gooden, filed herein, on the 18th day of July, 1910, that he is a full blood citizen of the Creek Nation of Indians, enrolled upon the citizenship rolls of said Nation opposite Roll Number 3133, that he is and was the lawful father of Misona Gooden Buttons, that the said Misona Gooden Button was a full blood citizen of the Creek Nation, or full blood Creek Indian, born since the closing of the Rolls of the Five Civilized Tribes.
