And the said party of the first part for said consideration hereby expressly waives appraisment of said real estate and all benefit of the Homestead Exemption and Stay Laws of the State of Oklahoma, and hereby further agrees to pay the indebtedness hereby secured and in addition thereto an attorney's fee amounting to 'Ten per cent of the amount due at the time of the foreclosure of this Trust Deed; provided this mortgare is foreclosed by an attorney of record in the State of Oklahoma.
