Whereas Peggy Taylor an allottee of the Cherokee Nation, has made application for the removal of restrictions from the following described land, to-wit

Lot one (1) and Northwest quarter (NW/4) of Southeast quarter (SE/4) of Northeast quarter (NE/4) less 34/100 (.34) acres for C.O.C. & S.R.R. right of way, Section One (1) Township Twenty two (22) North, Range Thirteen (13) East, and East Half (E/2) of Southea st quarter (SE/4) of Northeast Quarter (NE/4) of Section Eighteen (18) Township Twenty (20) North, Range Twenty two (22) East of the Indian Base and Meridian 69.67 acres, more or less.
