its successors or assigns, shall have the right to change the size of its said line of pipe, the damage if any, to crops, and surface by reason of such change, to be paid by the said grantee, its successors or assigns.

The damages for and because of the laying of the first line of pipe are included in the above payment. All damages thereafter to fences, crops and premises which may be suffered by reason of the maintenance operation or alteration of said li nes of pipe to be assessed under the direction of the Secretary of the Interior, , or in case of removal of restrictions as to the then owner thereof, said damages if not mutually agreed upon to be ascertained and determined by three disinterested persons, one thereof to be appointed by the owner of the premises, one by the Gulf Pipe Line Company of Oklahoma, its successors or assigns, and the third by the two so appointed as aforesaid, and the award of such three persons shall be final and conclusive.
