This Indenture of Lease made and entered into in quadruplicate, on this
 day of May 8th A.D. 1907 by and between L.W. Marks, Guardian of Jack Walker, a minor,
 of Vinita, Indian Territory, party of the first part, lessor, and The Knox Oil
 Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the United States in force
