DEED OF TRU ST.

THIS DEED, Made and entered into this 1st day of June A.D. 1910, by and between Leslie P. Huey and Katheryne A. Huey, his wife, of the county of St Louis, and State of Missouri, parties of the first part Thomas J. Quinn of the City of Tulsa, and state of Oklahoma, party of the second part, and Alfred Savory of the county of St Louis and State of Missouri, party of the third part/

Witnesseth that the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the debt and trust hereinafter mentioned and created and the sum of One dollar to them paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents, Grant Bargain, and sell Convey and Confirm unto the said party of the second part, the following described real estate, situate lying and being in State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

All of Lot No. Sixteen (16) and Seventeen (17) Block Fourteen (14) and all of lots No. thirty two (32) Thirty Three (33) and Thirty four (34) Block C No. Thirty five (35) of West Tulsa Addition, a subdivision of the Northwest quarter of section 14, Twp. 19, North, range 12, east according to the amended plat thereof, as of record.

To have and to hold the same with the appurtenances to the party of the second part, and to his successors or successors in this trust and to him and his grantees and assigns, forever, In Trust, however, for the following purpose:

WHEREAS, Leslie P. Huey and Katheryne A. Huey have this day made executed and delivered to the said party of the third part their promissory note of even date herewith by which they promise to pay to the said Alfred Savory or order for value received Three Hundred dollars one year after date, also two (2) semi annual interest notes of even date for \$9.00 each due six months and one year after date, all notes bearing interest from maturity at the rate of eight per cent per annum.

NOW THEREFORE, if the said party of the first part, or anyone for them shall well and truly pay off and discharge the debt and interest expressed in the said note when the same shall become due and payable according to the true tenor, date and effect of said note then this deed shall become void, and the property hereinbefore conveyed shall be released at the cost of the said parties of the first part, but should
