Now Therefore, I, under the authority vested in me by the Act of Congress approved May 27, 1908 (Public No. 140) and the regulations prescribed thereunder, hereby remove the restrictions from said above described land, such removal of restrictions to become effective only and simultaneously with the execution of deed by said allottee to the purchaser after said land has been sold in compliance with the directions of the Secretary of the Interior:

Lamb, and it appearing to the Court that the said Betty Frank is a full blood citizen of the Creek Nation of Indians; that Short Frank, the husband of said Betty Frank, died intestate while a bona fide resident of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, on the 1st day of February 1910, that the said Short Frank, deceased, was a full blood citizen of the Creek Nation of Indians; that as such citizen of said nation, there was allotted to the said Short Frank as his separate allotment of land the following described real estate, situate in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, to-wit,
