The Sigler Cattle Company may have this property for another year at the same price if it so elects before the expiration of this lease, and Vannest shall repair all the fencing on the place so as to make it a good four wire fence.

The said The Sigler Cattle Company agrees to drive no nails or other things into the walls or injure or in any way or any manner deface the same or any part of said property.

The said The Sigler Cattle Company agrees to take good care of said property, and to repair any damage done the same through their carlessness or neglect at their own expenses, and at the expiration of this lease to deliver up said property to the said Peter Vannest in as good condition as the same now is, reasonable wear and tear excepted.

The destruction of the buildings on said premises by fire shall work a termistion of this lease.

The said Peter Vannest is not to be held responsible for any damage done to the contents of said building by action of the elements.

The said The Sigler Cattle Company agrees to yield quiet and peaceable possession of said premises to the said Peter Vannest on the termination of this lease.
