The within lease is forwarded to the commissioner of Indian Affairs with recommendation that it be approved, to expire October 11, 1924, on condition that the lessee shall pay as royalty, in advance, on each gas well utilized, where the capacity is tested at three million cubic feet or less, per day of twenty-four hours, \$200 per annum, and where the capacity is more than three million cubic feet per day of twenty-four hours, \$50.00 per annum for each additional million cubic feet or major fraction thereof, all royalties and rentals accruing under this lease to be retained by this office until allotment of land is made final, and upon further condition that the action of the Department of the Interior in approving said lease does not in any manner determine the right of the lessee to proceed therein.
