

That John Tiger, deceased, was allotted in his lifetime lands described as the southwest quarter of section 26, township 18 north, range 14 east, locate in Tulsa county, state of Oklahoma, as a part of his distributive share of the lands and funds of the Creek Nation Indian Territory, now Oklahoma, and Patents were actually delivered to the said John Tiger, conveying said land to him, being duly approved by the Secretary of the Interior, under date of May 26, 1903; that thereafter, and while a resident of McIntosh county, Oklahoma, the said John Tiger departed this life, in the month of November, 1910, leaving no will and intestate, and leaving as his sole and only heirs at law, his wife, Louisa Tiger, and his only child, Susie Tiger, a child of the age of two years; that the said John Tiger was a full blood Indian, as enrolled by the records of the Commissioner to the five civilized tribes at Muskogee, Oklahoma; that said Louisa Tiger is a duly enrolled full blood Indian citizen of the Creek nation, Oklahoma, as appears from the records of the Commissioner to the five civilized tribes at Muskogee, Oklahoma; that the said Louisa Tiger on the 19th day of January, 1911, sold and conveyed all her interest, right, title, and estate in and to the above described land to Harry Smith, for the sum of Seven Hundred Dollars, according to the terms of a general warranty deed conveying said land to the said Harry Smith signed and executed by the said Louisa Tiger for a valuable consideration, on the said 19th day of January, 1911; and that the said deed so made ought and should be approved and confirmed in accord with the Prayer of the petition filed herein as aforesaid.

It is, therefore, ordered and adjudged to be the judgment and order of this court that the warranty deed made on the 19th day of January, 1911, by Louisa Tiger, in favor of Harry Smith, conveying all the interest, right, title and estate of the said Louisa Tiger in and to the southwest quarter of section 26, township 18 north, range 14 east, be and the same is hereby approved, confirmed and declared valid.
