

undivided one fourth interest in and to the fee simple title to the southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of section thirteen (13) of township sixteen (16) north and of Range Twelve (12) east of the Indian Base and Meridian and lying in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, the said land being the allotment of the above named decedent Wilson Rolland who was Creek Indian No. 1900 according to the enrollment of Creek Indian Citizens prepared by the Commissioners to the Five Civilized Tribes, and the said petitioners all appearing in person before this court and by their Attorneys F. M. Sutton and B. C. Conner and asks that the afore said deed be approved and confirmed in all particulars, and the Court hearing evidence and being fully advised in the premises, finds;

That the said decedent Wilson Rolland was Creek Indian No. 1900 according to the enrollment of Creek Indians prepared by the Commissioners to the Five Civilized Tribes; that as such Creek Indian Citizen he received as and for his allotment the southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section thirteen (13) of Township sixteen (16) north and of range twelve (12) east of the Indian Base and Meridian and situated in Tulsa County, Oklahoma; that said decedent was still the owner of the fee simple title to said land at the time of his demise; that said decedent died intestate and at the time of his said demise was maintaining his permanent residence in Tulsa County, Oklahoma; that said decedent died on or about March 28th 1910; that he left no issue nor parents surviving him; that the only persons who were next of kin to the said decedent and who survived him are his widow, Maude Rolland, a non citizen of the Creek Nation, his brother, Temarye Rolland who is Creek Indian Citizen No. 1901 and who is one of the petitioners, and his sister Susie Parkinson nee Rolland who is Creek Indian citizen No. 1899; that the said decedent and the petitioners herein, Temarye Rolland are enrolled by the commissioner to the Five Civilized Tribes as full blood Creek Indians and that the said Temarye Rolland is past twenty-one years of age in fact and also according to the enrollment by the commissioner to the Five Civilized Tribes as aforesaid; that the consideration stated in the deed above named is a good and adequate consideration for the interest conveyed in said land, that said deed was executed as the free and voluntary act and deed of the grantor thereof and that he fully understood said transaction and that the consideration named therein has been fully paid by the grantee thereof to the grantor thereof.

It is therefore hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed, that a certain deed executed by Temarye Rolland as Creek Indian Citizen No. 1901 to R. H. Kirk dated January 3rd, 1911, for a consideration of five Hundred Fifty and no/100 dollars, and conveying an undivided one-fourth interest in and to the southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirteen (13) of township sixteen (16) north and of range twelve (12) east of the Indian Base and Meridian and lying in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, is hereby confirmed and approved in all particulars.
