




If the lessee makes reasonable and bona fide effort to find and produce oil in paying quantity as is herein required of them and such effort is unsuccessful, they may at any time thereafter, with the approval of the Secretary of the Interior, surrender and wholly terminate this lease upon the full payment and performance of all dues then existing obligations hereunder: Provided, however, That approval of such surrender by the Secretary will be required only during the time his approval of the alienation of the land is required by law.

It is further agreed and understood that this lease shall be of no force or effect unless the part of the second part shall, within sixty days from the date of approval of the application filed in connection herewith, furnish a satisfactory bond in accordance with the regulations of March 20, 1905, prescribed by the Secretary of the Interior, which shall be deposited and remain on file in the Indian Office during the life of this lease.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF The said parties have hereunto subscribed their names and affixed their seals on the day and year first above mentioned. *the parties of the second part are jointly bound forth with the stipulations of this instrument, by and under of bond made and payable by the parties of the second part, as principals and the United States Surety and Guaranty Company, of Baltimore, Maryland, as surety, entered into the 9th day of June, 1905, and which shall be deposited and remain on file in the Indian Office during the life of this lease.*
